

- Develop online Canadian Content Teaching Sign Languages Curriculum
- Develop CEFR evaluation tool with an interactive approach and benchmarks that can be used for a standardized sign language instruction certification program
- Develop SLIC Language Passport, Language Portfolio and CEFR Competence including CEFR Descriptors in ASL, LSQ and Indigenous Sign Lan-guages versions


